- It's gotta be awesome.


Objectives

- · Develop and expand your concept of typography.
- Maximize your concepts by exploring and using different methodologies of type and image, where typography dominates.
- Apply design and gestalt principles for the construction of memorable typography.
- Design with typography to convey an interesting verbal and formal message.

Options

- **1.** Design a typographic movie poster—for a YouTube video.
- **2.** Hand letter something. Maybe a few things.
- **3.** Promote happiness or any other worthy cause with typography.
- **4.** Design and implement vinyl typography for your laptop (*you'll have to find a way to cut vinyl*).
- **5.** Write a letter to your younger self—something you wish you had known back then—with compelling typography.
- **6.** Capture the essence of a TED talk typographically (*for example: minimalism*).
- **7.** Something else, just run it by me first. Remember, this is a typography class, so like every other option the emphasis must be typography.

Note: you're welcome to think beyond the poster. Perhaps your message would best be delivered by a series of postcards, a handmade book, a pamphlet, an installation, a floor graphic, a hand lettered tent, table tents, curious leave behinds, a video, or...something else.

The final submission for this project will include:



- **3.** Mounted or unmounted finished project, whatever best presents your concept and form, printed or otherwise made tangible.


